

Mission u 2023

This year at Mission u, you will have your soul eyes opened, your body rested - some, and your mind spinning We will learn how the Aramaic is translated into English, and how different that can be compared to Greek translated into English.

This is important because, a lot of the Bible is translated from Greek, and that Greek is a translation itself from Aramaic. Who'd a Thunk it?

We will also learn a little about ubuntu. Never heard of it? Last year was the first time for me. Apparently, it is a little difficult to translate this African word into English, but the gist is, "I am human because you are human." I present a list of short ubuntu meanings that come from the book Everyday Ubuntu by Mungi Ngomane.

- 1. Ubuntu tells us we are only who we are thanks to other people.
- 2. Ubuntu lies at the heart of the power a crowd can harness for the common good. (See, sign up for those action alerts!)
- 3. Ubuntu encourages us to drop out judgements and embrace compassion and understanding.
- 4. Ubuntu teaches us that we should actively look at the world from every perspective, from every angle.
- 5. Perhaps the most crucial underlying principle of ubuntu is respect, both for oneself and for other people.
- 6. Ubuntu reminds us to try to see the good of everyone in all aspects of our daily lives.
- 7. Ubuntu teaches to choose hope (requires trust and having faith) over optimism (a feeling that doesn't last).
- 8. At times of stress and disconnect, ubuntu teaches us to reach out to humanity. Do not hide away alone.
- 9. Ubuntu tells us forgiveness can give us back our self-respect and dignity.
- 10. Ubuntu tells us to put aside national or societal differences and to see one another for what we are: human beings in this together.
- 11. Ubuntu teaches us always to look to one another for support. We don't need to struggle alone.
- 12. The essence of ubuntu defenses are shattered and connections are made when you make someone laugh.
- 13. Ubuntu tells us that gratitude for other people and what they do is what makes us human. The little things matter. Everyone matters.
- 14. Ubuntu invites us to listen to others as we would like to be heard.

There is a lot of gist here to chew on. If you come to Mission u, you will have a lot of sisterhood community to help. We all do better together. I have learned that I am a better human with you.

St. Paul's United Methodist United Women in Faith Collect Purses

UWF at St Paul's United Methodist Church in Albuquerque, New Mexico has been assisting Pursonalities Plus abq. by collecting new and/or slightly used purses along with personal items to fill those purses. Pursonalities Plus abq was founded in 2016 when they gifted 180 filled purses to deserving women in organizations supporting homeless, abused, recovering, and recently incarcerated women in the Albuquerque area. With the help of St Paul's, the number of gifted purses has grown to 2,066 gifted purses in 2022. The number of receiving organizations has grown to 29 in the Albuquerque area. Those 29 organizations include:

Alongside Ministries, Barrett House, Crossroads, Enlace Communitario, Family Promise, God's Warehouse, Joy Junction, Safe At Home, Steel Bridge Center of Hope, U Turn for Christ, and Wings.

The purses are filled with toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, soap, shampoo, brushes, combs, chap stick, hand sanitizer, tissues, etc. They are accessorized with donated scarves, gloves, hats, and jewelry. They are tagged with the Pursonalities Plus guiding scripture: Psalm 91:4 "He will cover you with his feathers, He will shelter you with his wings. His faithful promises are your armor and protection." Pursonalities Plus delivers the purses, with the assistance of the Albuquerque Police Department, as Mother's Day and Christmas gifts to the various women's programs.

St Paul's UWF created a collection box for the purses and/or items to fill/accessorize the purses. The box is in the church narthax. The purses and items are collected each Sunday and delivered to a member of the Pursonalities Plus Team.For more information about how you can help Pursonalities Plus abq contact Jane Bickleman at jbick@comcast.net or call 505-263-8366. 
