New Volunteer Opportunity: The Los Alamos County library system and LA First United Methodist Church collaborated to begin a computer assistance program at the public library in Los Alamos and White Rock. Tentatively beginning in March, volunteers will assist library patrons with basic technology skills. Training will be provided to volunteers. Skills may include using a mouse, 2-factor verification, resetting passwords, and negotiating

websites. The computer assistance program will happen in the White Rock Branch Library on Tuesdays 1-3 PM, and at the Mesa Public Library on Thursdays 4-6 PM.
